The District Commander, or someone appointed by him/her, shall give a report on the status of the Siegmund Fund at District Conventions.

**Section 2**. The "Gavel Club of Greater Houston" is hereby recognized, ratified and provided for as a subsidiary of The Twenty-Second District, Department of Texas, and The American Legion. Said subsidiary organization shall be administered by the Officers and Executive Committee as set out in the Constitution of said subsidiary organization.

# <u>ARTICLE VII – AUXILIARY</u>

**Section 1.** The American Legion Auxiliary, organized under the provisions of the National Constitution and By-Laws is a recognized Auxiliary of The American Legion, Department of Texas, Twenty-Second District.

## ARTICLE VIII – CONVENTIONS

Section 1. District Conventions shall be composed of:

- a. The District Commander and District Officers, none of whom, except the District Commander, shall be entitled to vote unless duly elected as a delegate to the Convention by their Post, and;
- b. Duly elected delegates from the Posts in the district.

#### Section 2. Delegates

- a. In the District Convention each Post shall be entitled to two delegates for the first fifteen members or less thereof. Each Post shall be entitled to one additional delegate for each twenty-five members or major fraction thereof in excess of fifteen, whose current dues have been received by the Department Headquarters thirty days prior to the date of said convention and one alternate for each delegate.
- b. The Department Adjutant provides the District Commander a verified copy of the voting strength of each Post in the District prior to the District Convention.
- c. Each elected delegate must be a member in good standing of the Post which they represent at the District Convention.
- d. All delegates registered at District Conventions may be required to present their current Paid-up American Legion Membership card before being permitted to register.

- e. Post Credential's Chairs must submit a completed and signed Delegate Certification form containing all elected delegates and alternates from their post to the District Convention Credentials Chair upon arrival to the Convention Site.
- f. The registered and certified delegates present at the District Convention are the only ones eligible to vote with their Post delegation.
- g. The registration fee for delegates at District Conventions held at a Post shall not exceed thirty dollars (\$30.00). The Pre-registration fee for delegates at District Conventions held at a hotel shall not exceed forty dollars (\$40.00). If the said convention is held at a hotel, the on-site registration fee shall not exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00). The exact amount to be charged at each convention shall be as recommended by the Convention Committee and approved by the District Executive Committee. Charges for extra activities other than dinner shall be approved by the District Executive Committee.

**Section 3.** The District Commander, if present, shall preside over the District Conventions, but may call the Vice Commander or delegate to the chair. In case of their absence of the District Commander and the District Vice Commander at the opening of a convention, the convention members will elect a presiding officer.

Section 4. Parliamentary procedures of the Conventions and Meetings of the Executive Committee shall be governed by *Robert's Rules of Order, Revised*, when not otherwise covered by this document.

**Section 5**. A quorum for transaction of business at a District Convention shall consist of the representation of a majority of Posts which are members of the Twenty-Second District, The American Legion, Department of Texas.

**Section 6**. The voting strength, on roll call votes, of each Post shall be in accordance with Department Rules for the Department Convention. All voices or standing votes shall be by each 22<sup>nd</sup> District Post member present with voting rights. If requested by any delegate a roll call must be held on any question. Voting may be conducted by written, secret ballot, with each post having the number of votes certified at the convention. Every person voting must be present on the floor of the convention.

Section 7. The program of the District Convention shall be limited to two days, including the opening date.

Section 8. The election of officers shall be the last order of business at the appropriate District Convention.

Section 9. If the appropriate convention shall fail to meet or to elect and install officers at the appointed time, those in office shall continue to exercise full authority until their successors are duly elected and installed.

**Section 10.** The provisions of these By-Laws shall become operative immediately upon adoption by the District Convention and subsequent approval by the Department of Texas. Immediately upon adjournment of the Convention at which these By-Laws are adopted all Posts in the District shall be notified by the District Adjutant of the changes in the Constitution and By-Laws, and shall be mandatory that all member Posts change their respective Constitution and By-Laws to conform thereto.

## ARTICLE IX – ELECTIONS

**Section 1**. The Commander, Vice Commander, Adjutant, Finance Officer a Judge Advocate, Historian, and a Sergeant at Arms shall be elected at the appropriate District Convention, and shall serve for a term of two years or until their successors are elected and installed.

**Section 2**. In case of death or resignation of the District Commander, or in case of continued disability of the District Commander, incapacitating him/her from performing the duties of their office, the Vice Commander shall exercise the duties of District Commander until the next election is held. In case of death, resignation, or continued disability of both the District Commander and the District Vice Commander, a majority of the Post Commanders of the District shall appoint a District Commander to serve until the next District Convention, at which time a District Commander and/or District Vice Commander shall be elected to fill the unexpired term.

**Section 3**. The District Commander and the other Officers of the Twenty-Second District, The American Legion, Department of Texas, shall be elected in terms of even numbered years.

**Section 4**. The District Commander and District Vice Commander shall be a member of a Post in the Twenty-Second District, and the only exception being set out in Article IV, Section 6 of the Department Constitution, and shall continue to be active therein during their tenure of office. Failure of the District Commander or District Vice Commander to comply with these provisions shall cause their office to be declared vacant by the Department Commander. If the office of District Commander becomes vacant, the District Vice Commander will assume the office and the duties thereof until the next District Convention, at which time a District Commander shall be elected to fill the unexpired term. **Section 5**. All elected and appointed officers as well as Committee Chairs must provide the District Commander a copy of their DD-214 or other form of proof of service before being installed in to their respective office or chairmanship.

Section 6. All officers of the District shall assume their respective duties immediately following the Department Convention at which time the District Commander and other

District Officers present are sworn in. The District Commander will swear in all new 22<sup>nd</sup> District Officers, not present at the Department Convention, at the first District Executive Committee meeting following the Department Convention

# ARTICLE X ENDORSING OFFICER CANDIDATES ABOVE DISTRICT LEVEL

**Section 1.** The 22<sup>nd</sup> District shall not endorse any candidate for Department office, who is not, at the time of the endorsement, a member of The American Legion, Department of Texas, 22<sup>nd</sup> District.

## ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENTS

**Section 1.** The 22<sup>nd</sup> District By-laws may be amended at any District Convention by a favorable roll call vote of the Posts resulting in approval by two-thirds (2/3) of the allocated delegates present on the floor.

**Section 2.** It is further provided that the proposed amendments shall have been read at such Convention at least two hours before being voted upon, and further provided that a record of the vote and the amendments shall be preserved.

Section 3. Section 4. All proposed amendments to the Twenty-Second District By-Laws must be presented to the Chairman of the Twenty-Second District Constitution and By-Laws Committee no later than two (2) hours after the start of the Convention.

# ARTICLE XII-BONDS OF OFFICERS

**Section 1**. The Finance Officer shall procure a bond for District Officers from a solvent surety company authorized to do business in Texas, in the sum of a minimum of two times the district monetary assets or a greater sum as directed by the Executive Committee of the Twenty-Second District. The bond is to be paid for by the Twenty-Second District.

# COMMANDER'S REPORT AMERICAN LEGION POST 164 22<sup>ND</sup> DISTRICT CONVENTION MARCH 26, 2022

American Legion Post 164 has had a very active year. Our Joint Honor Guard with VFW Post 9182 has completed 152 Funerals, 50 Flag Ceremonies, for 2577 Service hours to the community.

We have just recently sponsored a Junior Shooting Team the Houston Hot Shots. This team is 4 young ladies who are very good shots. Last month they qualified in the first round of completion by shooting 2337 out of a possible 2400. This month they shot the second round for the team and individual shooters. They shot 2332 out of 2400 and the top Individual shot 592 out of 600 with 43 bullseyes out of 60 shots.

Our Post again held the Oratorical Contest at the Post. We sent the Post winner and school winners to the District Competition. The Post winner then went on to compete at the Division Competition and won and went on to the Department Competition where he placed third.

Our Post also had 32 boys participate in Boy's State last year. We also annually award Scholarships to the Mayde Creek NJROTC along with other awards at their Change of Command Ceremony. We also get awards to Royal High Schools JROTC Program.

Post 164 is very active in our community. We participate in the Chamber Business After Hours each month where we meet other business owners and learn about their businesses. We also us this as a recruiting event. Our Post held an event at the post last year and it was very successful.

Post 164 collects flags all year round. We go out into the community at least 4 times a year to collect flags in need of retirement. We then have 2 retirement ceremonies each year. The first is around Flag Day June 14<sup>th</sup> and then near Veterans Day. At each ceremony we retire about 1000 flags.

# Americanism program success reported in 2021

The American Legion MAR 07, 2022 The National Americanism Division released its By-the-Numbers report for 2021. View and download it at www.legion.org/documents/pdf/americanism\_by\_the\_numbers\_2021.pdf.

The report shows that last year, American Legion members across the country upheld a 100 percent Americanism through their devotion, dedication and commitment to the success of Americanism programs at the local, state and national level, despite limitations surrounding ongoing safety measures with COVID-19. Highlights from the report include:

- 50,575 youth from 2,975 teams played American Legion Baseball.
- 31 American Legion Boys State programs reported having conducted a program.
- 2,089 Scouting units were chartered by American Legion Family members across the country, involving 38,315 youth.
- 21 American Legion departments have an established American Legion Youth Cadet Law Enforcement program.
- 48 American Legion department oratorical winners were certified of the 53 departments normally competing. (The 2021 National Oratorical Finals in Indianapolis was cancelled due to safety concerns regarding the pandemic.)
- 686 individual athletes and 88 shooting clubs entered the 2020-2021 postal round competition of The American Legion Junior Shooting Sports National Tournament.
- 2,377 students from throughout the nation were presented an American Legion School Award Medal
- 909 American Legion posts participated in American Education Week.

# **AMERICANISM AND CHILDREN & YOUTH "BY THE NUMBERS" FOR 2021**

#### American Legion Baseball

#### **Youth Education**

- \$792,521\* in fundraising was amassed during National Commander James "Bill" Oxford's 2021 Legacy Run year (1 October, 2020 – 30 September, 2021).
- 63 students were awarded a total of \$482,622 in academic scholarships from the national level.
- The 2020-2021 Consolidated Post Report states that 2,377 students from throughout the nation were presented an American Legion School Award Medal.
- The 2020-2021 Consolidated Post Report states that a total of **909** American Legion posts participated in annual American Education Week; an **increase of 242** from the previous year.

#### God and Country

• The 2020-2021 Consolidated Post Report reflects there were 1,106 posts that participated in the 2021 annual National Day of Prayer; this is an increase of 59 from the previous year.

#### Four Chaplains Sunday

• The 2020-2021 Consolidated Post Report reflects that **1,924** activities were conducted in observance of Four Chaplains Sunday; this is an **increase of 261** from the previous year.

#### Legion Conferences

• A total of **450** Legion family members attended the annual national Combined Americanism Conferences. Conference segments offered on a virtual platform included Oratorical, Junior Shooting Sports, Children & Youth, department chaplains and Scouting, while in-person conference segments were conducted for the Baseball and Boys State programs in Indianapolis during the same period.

#### Youth Welfare and Safety

• The 2020-2021 Consolidated Post Report reflects that a total of 808 posts held child health and safety activities throughout the nation (an increase of 225 from the previous year), while 1,709 posts conducted Halloween safety activities (an increase of 315 from the previous year).

#### American Legion Child Welfare Foundation (CWF)

• In 2021 the Child Welfare Foundation Board of Directors awarded \$639,328\* in 17 grants to 14 non-profit organizations that contribute to the physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual needs of children and youth.

#### American Legion Veterans & Children Foundation (VCF)

• The American Legion Endowment Fund Corporation, doing business as the Veterans & Children Foundation, contributed \$86,630\* as funding of the Temporary Financial Assistance program.
